John McBride introduced **Cristina Beloud**, Special Agent in Charge of US Secret Service, Phoenix Field Office. She is a 20-year veteran who has been in charge of the Px Field Office since July of 2013, having



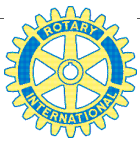
previously served as Resident Agent in Charge of the Tucson Resident Office. She was awarded the "Outstanding Public Service Award" for her leadership following the assassination attempt on Congresswoman Gabrielle Giffords. She received the "distinguished Service Award" from President George W. Bush for "Service to the Executive Office of the President following the attacks on 9/11.

Special Agent Beloud, a former Tucson Rotarian, praised the mission of Rotary and the good work we do both locally and internationally.. She shared interesting details of the history of the Secret Service and answered questions.

The Secret Service will be 150 years old next year—the oldest law enforcement agency in the US, also the smallest, only 7,000 working worldwide. It has a dual mission that includes investigations as well as protection of the President and Vice President.

THE ABCs OF ROTARY

When Cliff Dochterman became RI president in 1992-93 he published **The ABCs of Rotary**, a collection of short articles about Rotary first published in the weekly bulletin of his home club, the Rotary Club of North Stockton, California in a column called "Did Ya Know?" This collection, revised periodically, provides a guide for Rotarians to the colorful history of Rotary, its customs and traditions and the current status of its global programs.

Watch this section weekly to learn important Rotary facts, sometimes printed word-for-word from the booklet; other times, condensed or summarized and/or updated, sometimes modified slightly, but hopefully, always timely!

What is ROTARY?

Every Rotarian needs an **elevator speech**—and this just might be it! How do you describe the organization called "Rotary"? There are many characteristics of a Rotary club as well as the activities of more than a million Rotarians to consider in your description. There's *service, internationality, fellowship, classifications of each vocation, development of goodwill and world understanding, the emphasis on high ethical standards, concern for other people*, and many more.

In 1976, the RI Board of Directors wanted to create a concise definition of the fundamental aspects of Rotary. They turned to the three men who were then serving on RI's Public Relations Committee and requested a one-

sentence definition of Rotary. After numerous drafts, the committee presented this definition, which has been used ever since in various Rotary publications.

"Rotary is an organization of business and professional persons united worldwide who provide humanitarian service, encourage high ethical standards in all vocations and help build goodwill and peace in the world."

These 31 words are worth remembering when someone asks, "What is Rotary?"

Secret Service— (Continued from Page 1)

Ms. Beloud explained that the US Secret Service was established in 1865 as a bureau of the Treasury Department to address widespread counterfeiting during the Civil War. The Secret Service's protective mission began after President McKinley was assassinated in 1901 when Congress authorized the SS to protect the President. Protection of the Vice President was added in 1908. She gave an interesting historical perspective/timeline of changes in areas of focus based on critical national events:

- 1913 Congress approved permanent protection of the President
- 1915 President Wilson authorized the investigation of espionage
- 1917 The president's immediate family was to receive protection and any threats to the president were considered a federal crime.
- 1961 Protection was added to former presidents for "a reasonable period of time"
- 1963 Congress authorized two-year protection for Mrs. Kennedy and her two children
- 1968 After the assassination of Robert Kennedy, major presidential candidates received protection
- 1984 Credit card fraud considered a federal crime
- 1992 Protection of former presidents changed from "life" to 10 yrs
- 2000 Presidential Protection Act—SS works in the planning, coordination and implementation of security at all events designated as a National Security Event
- 2003 Secret Service transferred to the US Department of Homeland Security
- 2013 First female Director!

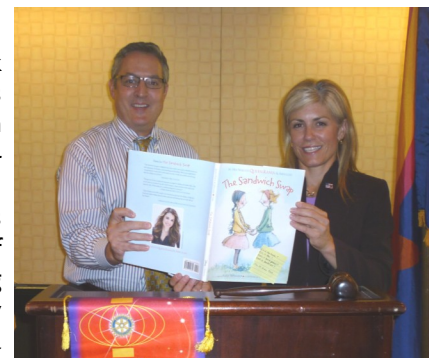
Members had the opportunity to examine samples of counterfeit money compared to "real" currency. In Phoenix the SS deals with about \$30 to \$60K a week in counterfeit dollars—she explained that offset printed money is more "crisp" and has a "3-D" feeling; whereas color copier printed notes are more "flat" and "blurry" In response to a question, Ms. Beloud explained

that passing counterfeit notes equals theft. Business owners aware of counterfeit money being passed should accept the note but "be a good witness" by paying particular attention to the person passing the note and then call 911—never confront the individual. Counterfeiters are more apt to buy small items and pay for it with a big bill. Business owners are simply "out" the dollars.

She also explained that details of presidential protection are now more *preventive* in nature—100% proactive— by doing better advance protective procedures. Two of her most memorable moments were accompanying Tipper Gore to the Wailing Wall in Israel and working on issues related to the attack on Gabby Giffords in Tucson.

In response to a question about turn-over, she indicated that, while the job is stressful, the biggest concern is how tough it is on families. She indicated that about 8% are women. Most training is internal; however in recent years more leadership training is contracted outside the agency due, simply to changes in the world.

Interesting that the book donated in Ms. Beloud's honor to the Osborn School District *The Sandwich Swap*, a delightful story that teaches lessons on the importance of tolerance, understanding and friendship, written by Her Majesty Queen Rania AlAbdullah of Jordan, had a personal connection. Ms. Beloud was involved in the Secret Service detail protecting the King and Queen!
